Rules regarding putting vehicles on the BMC-Leyland Car Club Inc Club Permit Scheme.

BMC-Leyland Car Club Inc CPS (Club Permit Scheme), the committee has decided that as of now, the following rules will now apply:

- 1. A vehicle that is BMC, Leyland, British or European will be admitted to the clubs CPS providing that the vehicle is 25years or older and is classified as a classic vehicle.
- 2. A non-BMC, Leyland, British or European vehicle can be admitted with the permission of the CPS Person and the committee only if that member already has a BMC vehicle with the club. This rule excludes all Japanese, Ford, Holden and the like, subject to Committee approval.
- 3. For any new vehicle on the CPS, permission must first be obtained by the full committee with the club CPS person having the final say.
- 4. Any vehicle in dispute will be submitted to a committee vote and the ruling is final.
- 5. Any breach of these conditions will mean that the vehicle will not be renewed at its renewal date.
- 6. Please check at the front of the newsletter to see who is available to sign renewals and new vehicles or contact our CPS Person.



This promises to be a fun weekend away with short distances between stops.



AOMC Information: THE STATE of play in VICTORIA What easing of Restrictions means for CLUB ACTIVITIES.

The Victorian State Government has released guidelines for the gradual easing of restrictions on social activities which will allow the resumption of limited club activity. Further easing of restrictions is slated for June 21St and for July. These are all dependant on how the States infection numbers are tracking. The following guidelines appear on the State Government DHHS website.

Travel. You will be able to stay in a holiday home or private residence you will be also able to stay in tourist accommodation, including caravan parks and camping grounds, where there are no shared communal facilities (e.g. kitchens and bathrooms). Tourist accommodation can open to guests provided there are no shared communal facilities such as kitchens or bathrooms.

Social Gatherings. You can attend public gatherings of no more than 20 people. Gatherings can happen in your home, in a public space or outside. The 20 person limit is exclusive of your household. That means for a family of five, you can be in a group with 5 other people from outside your household.

Community facilities are permitted to open with no more than 20 people allowed in each separate space, subject to the four squared metre rule, in addition to those required to operate the facility

There are no restrictions on the type of gatherings you can have, and you are obliged to record people's details. But as always, we're urging Victorians to use common sense in their activities. It's up to all of us to make this work.

AOMC Summary for Car Clubs. Social gatherings of up to 20 people is allowed, but social distancing practises must be maintained with everyone keeping a distance of 1.5 metres. This means that face to face committee meetings could be resumed as long as the meeting space is sufficient for social distancing. Many clubs use community facilities such as libraries or some other community facility for their meetings, and these are able to operate under the 20 person limit.

Travel restrictions have been lifted, and there will be no limit on the distance you can travel (although crossing state borders would need clarification from various state bodies.) You can go for a drive, but the only passengers should be members of your own household. Club runs could conceivably take plus, but social gathering restrictions would need to be enforced at start and finish points, hence limited attendance. Be wary that all Covid guidelines are open to interpretation by enforcement officers


Holiday accommodation is allowed, but the use of communal facilities (kitchens, toilets, showers) is not permitted. This means only self contained camping facilities or accommodation with enquires would be available to stay in. There is no limit on how long you can stay, but common sense is encouraged. From June 21, up to 20 people can attend auditoriums providing the appropriate social distancing measures are in place and the venue can accommodate the requirements. This will need to be confirmed when the State Government makes its announcement on that date.

The above could change at any time depending on Comrade Dan.
